
Mathematics and Computing

Alberto Giacometti was a Swiss sculptor, painter, draftsman and printmaker. Beginning in 1922, he lived and worked mainly in Paris but regularly visited his hometown Borgonovo to see his family and work on his art.

Giacometti was one of the most important sculptors of the 20th century. His work was particularly influenced by artistic styles such as Cubism and Surrealism. Although he also worked with painting and drawing, he is best known for his human figures.


Special School Lunch Dates








In DT, we have been tasting different sandwich fillings in preparation of making our sandwiches. The children were very brave and stepped out of their comfort zones!

















In computing, we have researched and presented information about a topic we have been studying. We then presented these to the rest of our class.

Year 6




Year 6 have been hard at work publishing their narratives in English. We produced a first draft and then edited and improved this before writing it up in neat.



Job Description

Children and Families Lead



This is an exciting opportunity to grow and develop our children's ministry working alongside an enthusiastic and committed group of volunteers. We are looking for someone with fresh vision to lead this new initiative.

This role includes weekly attendance at Sunday Services, Storytelling (a service for pre-schoolers and their families), Messy Church (a monthly service of story, song, craft and food) and The Well (Junior Church provision during the 10:30am sung Eucharist, currently suspended), with seasonal engagement with schools and the community. There may also be occasional meetings on weekday evenings, the remaining hours being spread flexibly.

Role and Key Responsibilities

Coordinating and leading St Mary's children and families work, encouraging children and their families in the church and local community to become rooted, and grow in faith in Jesus Christ:

Building and overseeing volunteer teams to facilitate children's participation Contributing to the leadership team

Exploring ways to ensure growth across work with children and families

Growing our vision by:

building relationships with our local community, shaping and implementing new initiatives nurturing intergenerational relationships within the church family leading by example and helping parents and carers to nurture their children in faith, including growing partnerships with our Overleigh C. of E. primary school

Key Responsibilities include:

working alongside our Safeguarding Officer to ensure compliance with Safeguarding, Health & Safety, Data Protection and other statutory policies in liaison with other stakeholders managing children's work budget

Skills and Qualities

We are looking for someone who is good at building faith and relationships. Someone who:

is a committed, practising Christian, who is able to inspire faith in others

can build relationships and communicate well with children and families both within and beyond the church

can inspire, engage and pray with children

can teach clearly by word and example, and is confident to speak and lead in gathered worship

We are looking for someone who can plan ahead, think creatively and work well in a team. Someone who:

has good organisational and administrative skills

is a team builder, able to build, inspire, train, encourage and sustain teams of volunteers; can delegate and oversee effectively;

is innovative and creative, demonstrating energy, passion and motivation to inspire others is able to use IT creatively

Experience Required

Experience of working with children aged o – 11 years, ideally with experience in leading children's work in a Christian context, working with families

Ideally experience of leading volunteers, and of leading and working in teams is preferable.

Working Specification

The role is 20 hours per week. We offer flexibility in the working pattern where possible. The post holder needs to be flexible, currently we anticipate around 50% of the time being spent on core activities and responsibilities, with this proportion increasing as more activities begin.

Securing future water supplies for Chester We recently wrote to let you know we're investing over £16 million to make sure everyone in Chester receives a reliable and sustainable water supply, now and for the future. We all deserve an up-to-date, reliable water network to keep your water flowing for whenever you need it, that's why we're installing a brand-new water pipe from Huntington Water Treatment Works to Boughton Water Treatment Works.

Important information

Before our works can start, other utilities need to carry out work, we know that this can be a nuisance so we're working collaboratively with BT and Cadent to get all work completed in one time period.

So we can complete our work as quickly as possible we'll be working longer days during the week and also over the weekends. We've explored all options to carry out our work but unfortunately, we'll need to close the road in sections. Traffic Management is there to protect everyone while we work on our water network. We work closely with local authorities and the Highways Agency and can't remove our Traffic Management until all work is completed and the area is made safe again.
