The internet age has been a wonderous event in human history, bringing the power to create, write and access all the information in the world with but a few flurries across a keyboard. The advent of social media, and the ensuing creation of the always online society of the past decade though, has brought formerly distant vulnerability windows far closer to home. As people have got more intelligent about navigating these opportunities for harm, those who seek to harm internet users have become better at evading detection by said users. The area of sexploitation is one of these vulnerability windows. Unscrupulous individuals have evolved their tactics to include infiltration of friends groups, the manipulation of Instagram accounts and recently the deployment of AI. All in the cause of gaining access to explicit photographs, videos and messages for the purpose of gratification or financial blackmail. 








Look at our super writing this week!

In Maths we have been finding addition and subtraction fact families.















In PSHE we thought about what makes use special and unique and made our own cubes displaying these qualities.










Our mastery target in English was is to use commas in lists, so we wrote words on post-it notes and created sentences using commas.

In Music, we have been exploring and performing Samba beats. We have looked at different rhythms and practised playing them at different times.







Last week, it was anti-bullying week. In Year 4, we designed posters and wrote poems linked to this years theme - 'Make a Noise About Bullying'.

In DT, we have been looking at shell structures. We learnt how scoring the fold lines makes it neater and easier to fold. We then practised making boxes from nets.

























In DT, we have been looking at designing and making bags linked to our work in History on The Maya. The children have been designing and making a prototype bag as well as developing their sewing skills.
