

#### Here's what children and young people told us they need from you:

We don't need to have 'one-off conversations about our mental health' – sometimes a chat on a journey or at bedtime is enough.

I need to know it's okay to talk to you about any and all of my feelings. Please hear what I have to say, without interrupting me.



Please listen to me carefully and acknowledge how I am feeling – it might seem silly to you but what I am going through is important to me.



Playing with pets can make me feel better. Same with playing football, basketball or whatever type of sport I am into.



Don't compare my experiences to your own when you were a child.

Sometimes I just need you to listen and hear what I'm saying – I don't always need answers (or lectures)

Please don't worry about trying to fix things for me – I often just need to know you are there for me and understand what I am going through.



If you are open with me about your feelings, this can help me to be more open about mine.

Sometimes I don't want to talk. Please trust that I will come to you (or another grown-up or someone my own age) when I'm ready. Sometimes it's easier for me to talk to someone nearer my own age – my siblings, cousins, friends, younger teachers at school - because they 'get it'.



Sometimes a hug is all it takes to make me feel supported.

#### HIGHWAYS IMPROVEMENT WORK

#### CARRIAGEWAY RESURFACING AND SIGNAL IMPROVEMENT WORKS OLD DEE BRIDGE, HANDBRIDGE.

#### FROM MONDAY 19TH FEBRUARY TO THURSDAY 29TH FEBRUARY

We will be carrying out carriageway and footway resurfacing works On the Old Dee Bridge. Works will take place from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February to Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> February 2024 We will be working during the day generally between 08:00hrs – 17:00hrs (8am- 5pm) The bridge will be permanently closed to all vehicles for the duration of the works. Please note that elements of these works are weather dependent, and dates may change subject to weather conditions.

Old Dee Bridge will be closed to vehicles. Pedestrian access will be maintained where possible, however, any unforeseen issues during the works may warrant the closure of the footway. Also note that Castle Drive at its junction with Lower Bridge Street will be closed with no vehicular access in or out of the junction, vehicular access will be via Grosvenor Road junction only.

Please see detailed diversion route plan overleaf.

Note - cyclists will need to dismount to use the pedestrian walkway. Should a pedestrian closure be required, a temporary pedestrian diversion will be available via Grosvenor Bridge or the Suspension Bridge from Victoria Crescent to The Groves.

It is anticipated that the works will take approximately 10 days to complete, however pending investigation on site, there is the potential for closure to be in place for up to 2 weeks.
